May 18, 2016, Range Day shoot and Lunch**This is for paid members of the 711 Club/ guests**

This is a reminder that the annual range day will be held on May 18, 2016, at the Kenneth Royal Range. You are **not** required to qualify for in state CCW authorization.

If you want to qualify for out of state carry (18USC 926c/ HR 218):

Bring your own weapon, and a holster. You must shoot from a holster. **You bring your own ammo** -The session is 20 rounds per qualification.

The range fee has been waived by Sheriff Jones, for SSD.

As usual, the range qualifications will start about 0800 and continue until about noon.

The Lunch will be catered by Mike Garcia and the Tai-Mex catering.

The lunch is \$15.00 and will include sodas and cold water.
