May 16, 2018, Range Day and Lunch This is for paid members of the 711 Club

This is a reminder that the annual range day will be held on May 16, 2018, at the Kenneth Royal Range. You are **not** required to qualify for in-state CCW authorization.

If you want to qualify for out of state carry (18USC 926c/ HR 218):

Bring your own weapon, and a holster. <u>You must shoot from a holster</u>. You bring your own ammo -The session is 20 rounds per qualification. Your Retired ID must be current to shoot. If it is expired you will not be able to shoot for qualification. Range staff will check for your SSD/Retired ID before they send you to the firing line, to ensure you are an eligible shooter.

The range fee has been waived by Sheriff Jones, for SSD. As usual, the range qualifications will start about 0800 and continue until about noon. The Lunch will be catered by Mike Garcia and the Tai-Mex catering. The lunch is \$15.00 and will include sodas and cold water.

THE LUNCH MUST BE PAID IN ADVANCE DUE TO NO SHOWS. Pay at the March or April meetings.

You must have a R.S.V.P. before Thursday, **May 10**, 2018. I need to know if you are going to shoot even if you are not planning on eating.
